ORR-Funded Medical Assistance

ORR-Funded Medical Assistance (OFMA) provides foster care type health coverage benefits and services to unaccompanied refugee minor (URM) youth and other URM populations until the termination of extended foster care coverage, typically up to age 21 depending on the state.

Program Structure

The OFMA program is administered by the U.S. Committee for Refugees and Immigrants and is federally funded through the Office of Refugee Resettlement. USCRI contracts with a third-party administrator named Point Comfort Group (PCG) to provide services under OFMA. There are no copays and healthcare providers are reimbursed through contracts with PCG or through single case agreements.

Covered Healthcare Services

OFMA includes the same medical, dental, and pharmacy benefits as Medicaid. Below are some of the services that are covered by OFMA:

- Hospital services
- Doctor and clinic visits
- Prescription drugs
- Licensed behavioral/mental health professionals
- One routine vision exam and one pair of glasses*
- Emergency dental care*
- Interpretation services
- Transportation to qualifying appointments

**Dental and vision benefits vary by state.*

OFMA Eligibility

An individual may qualify for OFMA if they:

- Meet the immigration status and identification requirements:
 - Refugees (REF)
 - Asylees (ASY)
 - Cuban/Haitian Entrants (CHE)
 - Victims of Human Trafficking with an Eligibility Letter from OTIP (VOT)
 - Lawful Permanent Resident (LPR) who has held one of the above statuses
 - Amerasians (AMR)
 - Iraqi and Afghan Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) Holders
 - Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS)
- Has received federal approval to enter the URM Program
- Has not reunited with a parent or united with non-parental with legal guardianship
- Has not been adopted
- Has not reached the maximum age for foster care in the state
- Is ineligible for the state Medicaid program or The Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)

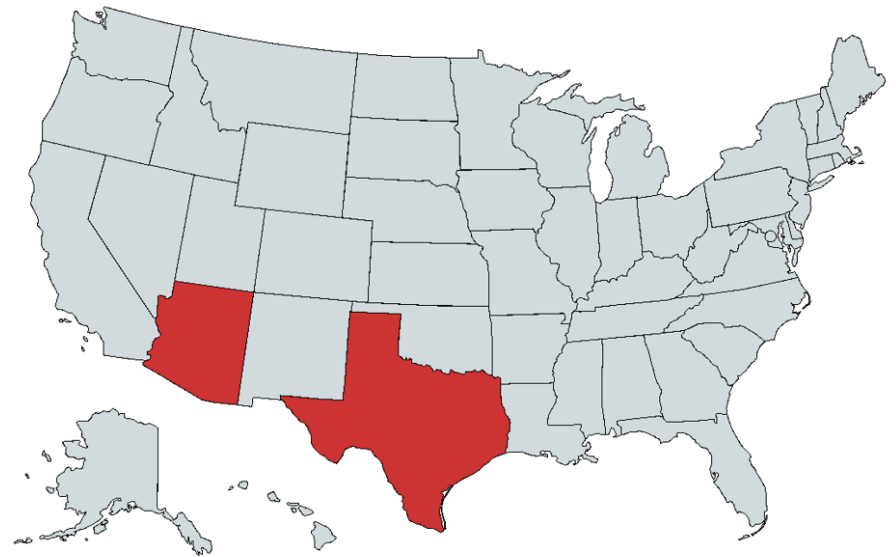
How to Apply
